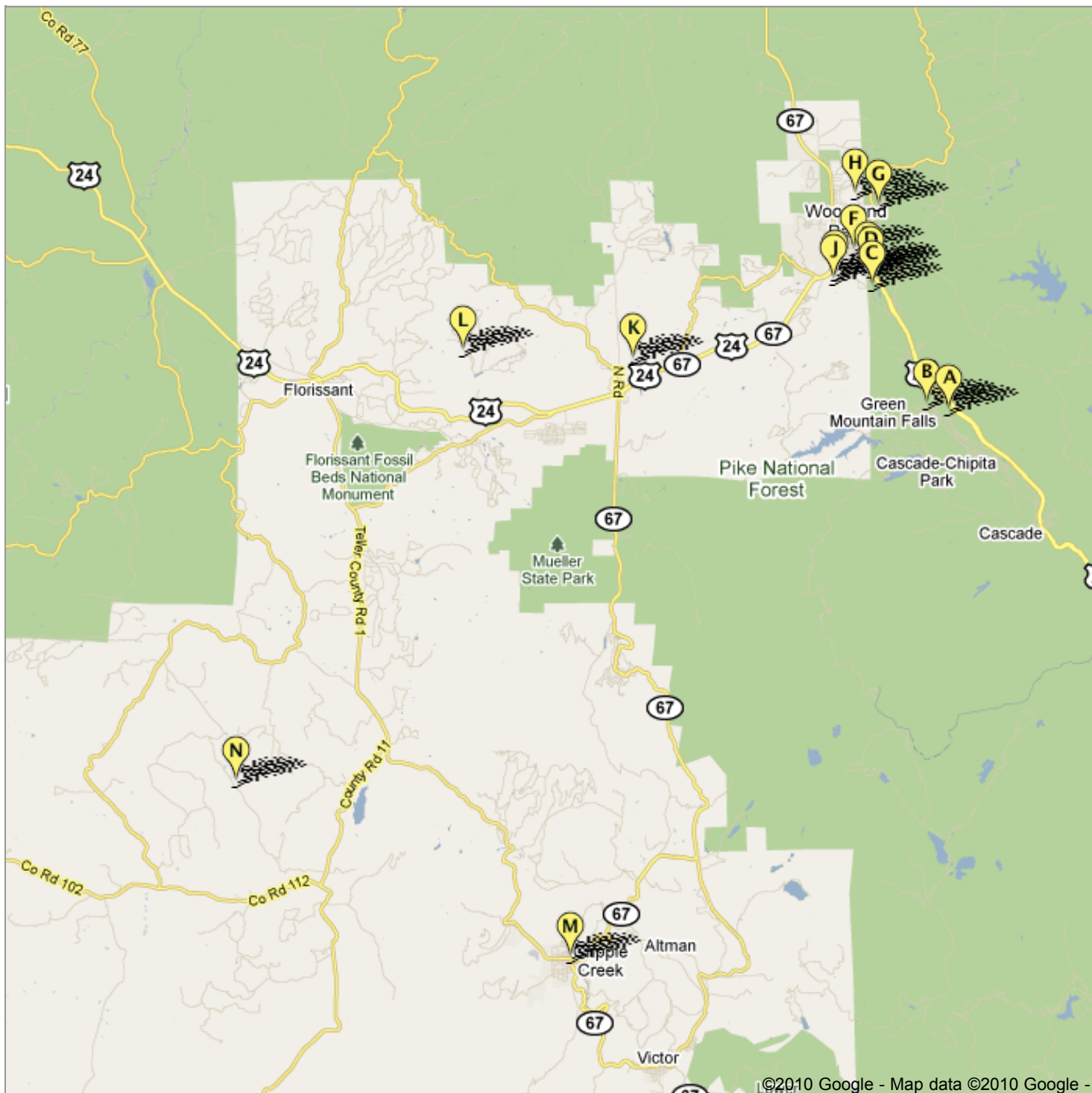

We've had lots of greens and beautiful tomato plants. Our beans and cucumber haven't died but they're not flourishing, either. Our pepper plants are doing okay and the squash plant is threatening to take over.

From 24, take CR5 (North Rd) north. At the Y bear left on to CR51 and drive another 3 miles. CR 51 will make a right turn but don't do it! Go straight onto CR512. Drive 1.5 miles and make a left onto Blue Mesa when the pavement ends. When Blue Mesa curves left and goes down hill go straight onto Lost Lake (about 0.6 miles). Take the second left (marked by a gate and a bunch of number signs, Barb's is 343) follow the road straight for about 1/3 mile. The road is kind of rough and you go past a green house (not a greenhouse). Just past the house, on the left, are our garden beds.

Helen Olson is Teller County's pioneer in year 'round greenhouse gardening. Her success with a dome greenhouse inspired the Harvest Center's purchase of a geo-dome greenhouse. You will also see her new lap pool greenhouse!

Her ranch is about 10 miles northwest of Cripple Creek. From the intersection of CR 11 and CR 111 head west for 5 miles. CR 111 is also known as Slater Creek Road.
